

#### **Course structure**

10 units are delivered in 6 months. 3 hours of virtual class sessions and 3 hours assessment/ delivery per week, which are virtual as well.

#### This course offers:

- 3 hour virtual sessions per week
- 26 delivery weeks + 4 week holiday
- 3 hour assessment/tutorial virtual sessions per week for 26 delivery weeks
- 15 hours structured self-paced online learning
- 12 hours mandatory work placement

# **Career pathways**

The course outcomes for graduates will vary greatly depending on existing qualifications and experience. In general, this course is intended to provide participants with the following Career pathways:

- Teaching English to groups of students in Australia
- Teaching English as a Second Language (ESL) overseas
- Teaching English as a Second Language (ESL) online
- Teaching conversational English in Australian language schools where a higher education degree is not required

### **Entry requirements**

Achieved a pass level or higher at the completion of Australian senior secondary school (Year 12).

Evidence of having this level of English ability may include:

- Secondary School transcripts showing the required results in English
- Completion of a Certificate III or higher level course in the Australian Qualification

- A pass mark achieved in an English language proficiency test – either a standardized test, or a test
- Produced specially for this purpose
- Teachers, trainers, lecturers or other supervisors of education programs confirming English language

## **Delivery and assessment**

Delivery: This program is delivered by 'Virtual Training Delivery'.

This program is delivered virtually via Microsoft Teams with 5 hours classes and 2.5 hours tutorials per week, and assessments and resources online via the Learning Management System. Some inperson attendance may be required for placement hours or mandatory workshops.

Students must complete mandated work placement hours of 12 hours including a combination of 6 hours ESL classroom observations and 6 hours teaching practice.

Assessment: Assessment: A range of assessment methods are used for this program may include but not limited to the following:

- WBT Workbook Tasks including: Short answer questions (e.g. one word answers, sentence answers, locating examples or relevant information etc.)
- Case studies, matching / Multiple Choice questions, short Projects (e.g. developing lesson plans, collecting resources / activities)
- Research / analysis of real life case study, portfolio (e.g. collection of activities and resources etc)
- PTT Practice Teaching Tasks including:,
   Observation of experienced teachers
- Portfolio (e.g. collection of lesson plans and associated activities / resources)
- Practical demonstration (e.g. delivering lessons, conducting activities).
